Botany/Ecology Project

It is time to give back to our community and we want to focus our efforts on our most important local natural resource, the Sandusky River Watershed. Our students need to understand how their efforts and volunteer hours can make a difference in their community. Through this stewardship project, our students will not only learn that taking care of their watershed, the Sandusky River, will make a difference in their community but also impact everyone in the Great Lakes Watershed.

Students will come to better understand how taking care of our water is valuable, life sustaining, and essential to our future. These waders will allow our kids to wade directly in the river to clean the riverbed, conduct water quality testing, learn about invasive and native plant species, and learn how to manage a healthy river ecosystem for future generations.

Our students will partner with our local water conservatory, park district, mayor, community, and other stakeholders all while learning regulations and environmental laws.

This project can change the thinking of our students on a large scale because they will learn to understand that their community can be changed for the better through their interest and hard work.
