### Bucyrus Elementary School - Board Report

Financial - We made \$1400 for our March 22 Leadership Day. BES worked concessions at three tournament basketball games bringing in \$538.

Building and Grounds - Our building and grounds are in good repair.

Staffing - No new staffing to report.

Enrollment - P-84(+1), K-106(-2), 1-87(-2), 2-89(-1), 3-107(-2), 4-78(+1), 5-82(-2) --- (-7 net change for February).

Professional Development - March 29, will be our next PD day in the district, while our teachers involved in Closing the Gap will present at SST7 on May 10.

Building Safety - The Emergency Situation Training at BES held on March 7, was successful with many realizations on the part of the school and law enforcement as well. We will have tornado drills in April and May. We are looking at evacuating students off-site in the fall of 2018 as another drill with police, fire, and other first responders involved.

Recent Events - February 26 - BES had 12 principals from other Leader in Me schools come for a coaching day. Our students provided tours, a skit, and a panel discussion. On February 27, our adult lighthouse leaders went to Wynford for their coaching day. On February 28, we had six representatives from our student lighthouse team travel to Mohawk for a student lighthouse kickoff assembly with their entire elementary body. Our students introduced speakers, then participated in another panel discussion. March 2, was the kickoff to right to read week in which members of the staff put on a skit for the students and a challenge of reading 700,00 minutes in one month. On March 8, author Chris Rumble spoke to our students during the day and our parents in the evening. We had a great turn out at Family Literacy Night with 309 people attending while feeding 238. March 9, we had 12 teachers from Graham elementary visit to learn about how we make The Leader in Me work from day to day. We showed them around with great transparency for three hours, while giving them time to talk to our students and staff. The day included a building tour, STEM activities, Leadership Notebooks presented by our students, as well as a panel discussion. March 20, marked the third session in the book study with our families. There are approximately seven moms and one dad that attend. Baby sitting is provided by a staff member.

Upcoming Events - March 22, Leadership Day from 9 am to 2 pm. Seventy (70) guests are scheduled to participate. March 28, we will be having Parent-Student conferences. March 28, is PTO Family Fun Night from 5 pm to 8 pm. March 29, is our professional development for staff.

Curriculum - We will be having instructional walks on Tuesday, March 27. Possible schedules for 2018 have been given to the BLT to discuss with TBTs. One grade level meeting has been held to further discuss possibilities.

Committees - Crawford Reads 20 continues to work toward Auctionfest 2018, Saturday, April 14.

Special Needs - Our RtI team met March 15. Positive reviews have been given with regard to the change in assessing student needs and providing teachers with intervention recommendations.
