



Student Wellness and Success Funds & Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid Plan – FY2026

Ohio's districts and schools receive Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid and Student Wellness and Success Funds to fund initiatives to support wraparound services for Ohio's students. These vital services help students overcome obstacles to learning, accelerate learning and prepare for future success.

Bucyrus City School District's SWSF and DPIA Plan will include the following:

- Spend at least 50% of Student Wellness and Success Funds on physical or mental health services.
- The plan for using Student Wellness and Success Funds and Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid will collaborate with Mid-Ohio Educational Service Center.
- The Student Wellness and Success Fund and DPIA plan will be shared with the Bucyrus Board of Education and posted to our website within 30 days after development or amendment of the plan.
- The Superintendent and/or Treasurer will report annually to ODE how the district spent Student Wellness and Success Funds and Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid.
- Bucyrus City Schools will expend Student Wellness and Success Funds in accordance with state requirements. Funds will be utilized by the end of the fiscal year following receipt. All prior-year funds have been or will be expended in accordance with required timelines. Funds received in FY25 will be expended by June 30, 2026.
- [Ohio law](#) does not specify the timeline in which Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid must be spent, but our District will leverage these funds in a timely manner to support the critical needs of students.

Ohio law outlines allowable uses for Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid (DPIA) and Student Wellness and Success Funds (SWSF). Bucyrus City Schools will utilize these funds to support student wellness, safety, and overall student success in alignment with guidance from the Ohio Department of Education and Workforce.

Student Wellness and Success Funds (SWSF)

Student Wellness and Success Funds will be used to support the following initiatives:

1. **Physical Health Services** – Continued employment of school health providers to assess and address students' physical health needs throughout the school day.
2. **Mental Health and Family Support Services** – Continued employment of school counselors, social workers, and school and family support staff to provide mental health support, behavioral interventions, and connect families with resources.



Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid (DPIA)

Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid funds will be used to support the following initiatives:

1. Student Behavioral and Mental Health Supports – Continued employment of school psychologists and Registered Behavior Technicians (RBTs) to provide behavioral and mental health support to students.
2. School Safety – Continued employment of a School Resource Officer to support a safe learning environment, assist with prevention efforts, and connect students and families with community resources.

Administrators and staff members will review the plan yearly and adjust as necessary for the benefit of all students.

It is understood that Bucyrus City Schools will provide the services listed in a way that best serves the students of the school district for the duration of the availability of Student Wellness and Success Fund or similar funding source(s).
